One Pager Directions

What In It?

A one pager is a single-page response to your reading that connects the ideas in the novel to your thoughts creatively. The purpose of the one-pager is so that your audience will understand the big ideas,

themes, and connections within the novel.

□ Litle, Outhor & Rating

The book title and author must be written in a creative and legible font. You should also write a rating out of five stars and why you rated it that way.

□ Border

Include a border that reflects the book somehow.

This can include words, pictures, symbols, or quotes from the text

□ Images

Draw or create THREE images that represent themes, characters, conflict, or the setting of the book. These should be strongly connected to the book and should stand out. Write what the image symbolizes.

□ Personal Statements

Write TWO personal statements or connections about what you've read (these are not simple opinions).

EX: "I could relate to the main character feeling lost in the book because it reminded me of when I got to high school and didn't know anyone.

□ Word Cluster

Create a word cluster: What was a theme from this novel? Put the word you choose on the paper in bold and cluster words around it that support it as the theme. At least ten words in the word cluster

□ Quotes

Include THREE interesting and most meaningful quotes or passages from the book. Include quotation marks and a citation (page number). If your passage/ quote is a part of dialogue, include the character's name who said it.

□ Questions

Create and answer TWO meaningful questions about the novel.

- -These should not be yes or no questions, but how or why questions.
- -Answer the question!

□ Ligurative Language

Create TWO examples of figurative language (simile, metaphor, hyperbole, alliteration, etc.) from the novel.

□ Poetry

Write a poem about a part of the novel (such as a character, conflict, theme, etc.). If you struggle with writing poetry, consider an acrostic poem – each letter represents a word).

No white space- After all required elements have been completed, make sure that you do not have any white spaces on your One-Pager. Choose a background color that represents your character.

Be colorful and neat.

Your entire page should be filled with these elements.

If you find you have extra room, repeat any of the above steps/ elements.

No space should be blank.

Nothing should be left in pencil.

Your name and class should be on the BACK of the one-pager.

NOTE: Creativity is worth up to an additional 4 points.
