

Film and Literature Unit Reading for Enrichment

This term, we will be studying film and literature during Reading for Enrichment. The goal of this activity is to help you learn how to analyze what you read and what you see, and you'll get to pick what you're reading. It doesn't matter if you want to read Harry Potter or Jane Eyre, YOU get to pick. There are a few guidelines, and you'll still be learning concepts in class, but instead of basing them on a book we read as a class, they will be applied to your book. You will be posting about your book on your blog, you will discuss your book in class, and we will be watching parts of some of your movies in class.

For this unit, please choose a book that is:

- MADE INTO A MOVIE OR TV SHOW that you would be allowed to watch
- At least 200 pages
- Appropriate for a middle school student (in content, reading level, etc.)
- Something you have not read before
- Not being read by another student in the class (first come, first served)
- Approved by the teacher and your parent(s) (see attached "permission form")


## Before you begin:

- Spend some time researching books, talking to friends, reading reviews etc. You want to choose something that you are EXCITED to read.
- Complete the attached form and submit it (no later than Wednesday 3/27/19)


## Assessment:

- Complete and return the attached form no later than Wednesday 3/27/19 (10 points)
- Blog posts and other assignments to be completed in class
- Book/Movie comparison: you'll watch the movie adaptation of your book and complete a compare/contrast assignment for the book/movie. Further instructions will be given in class.

FYI:

- If you finish your book before we are done with the unit, you should find another book to read that meets the above criteria. You need to be reading throughout the whole unit. (You are only required to watch one movie.)
- You may stop your book in the middle and start a new one if you get permission first.
